# **Community Listening Service**



Hello Readers

My name is Ingrid Penny and I am the Volunteer Coordinator for the Community Listening Service for Aberdeenshire.

### So what exactly is the listening service?

We all face challenges at some point in our life, ill-health, bereavement, relationship breakdowns, unemployment, unequal opportunities and situations where we find it difficult to cope. So often people do not want to burden their family and friends, so talking to someone out-with that circle can be just what is needed.

The Listening service is open to anyone aged over the age of 18, appointments are held face-to-face in the GP Practice / Health Care setting and last for up to 50 minutes.

The Listening Service provides a safe space for the patient to verbalise whatever gets in their way of health and wellbeing. It is confidential and non-judgemental. We are not a counselling service nor is it any kind of psychological intervention. It is about accompanying a person as they tell their story in a safe environment.

### Listening service

For patients registered at Fyvie/Oldmeldrum appointments are held in the Health & Social Care Hub in Inverurie. The HUB is attached to Inverurie Medical Practice, Upperboat Road, Inverurie.

## MELDRUM WOMAN SERVED IN TWO WORLD WARS

Remembrance Sunday is a poignant occasion when we pay tribute to those who fell in the two World Wars and in more recent conflicts. Helen (Nellie) Gerrard (1897-1974) always attended the event at Meldrum Parish Church and had good reason to because she was very proud of having served in the 1914-18 and 1939-45 wars. She was born at Oldmeldrum, where her father, James, was a farmer. She was one of many who responded to the call to join the Women's Auxiliary Army Corps (WAAC) during World War I.

Nellie worked as a cook at the British Expeditionary Force's base depot at Camiers in northern France and served abroad for 15 months. At the base depots and hospitals, soldiers, including those recovering from their wounds, were able to enjoy the hot, nourishing food cooked by the WAACs. Nellie was discharged from Queen's Mary's Auxiliary Army Corps – the WAAC's new title – on April 28, 1919. Her superior at the Camiers depot wrote to her mother, Margaret, saying: "I feel I should like you to know how sorry we are to lose her. She has been a thoroughly reliable good worker – also a very good girl whilst in this depot. I hope she will be really successful in her civilian life."



She served in uniform during World War II but this time in the Women's Auxiliary Air Force, serving initially as a cook at RAF Dyce. Nellie (pictured) later transferred to the RAF Police and spent most of her five years' service stationed in Aberdeen where she was concerned mainly with the welfare side of the police. In 1946 she was awarded the British Empire Medal (Military Division), which prompted a congratulatory letter from an officer in the RAFP's Provost Marshal's Department, who wrote: "It is grand recognition of all the good work you have done for the WAAF police, and we are all so pleased about it."

One occasion which gave Nellie great cause for pride was when she was invited to a reunion of Great War veterans from east Aberdeenshire at the Beaton Hall, Methlick, on August 4, 1964, to mark the 50th anniversary of the conflict's outbreak. Nellie was the only woman among the 200 veterans who attended the event.

Other women with Oldmeldrum connections who served in uniform during World War II included: **Alison Catto**, nee Manson, who was a radar plotter in the Women's Auxiliary Air Force. She was at the underground control bunker at RAF Stanmore Park, near London, when it was bombed. **Tibbie Halliday** was a corporal in the Auxiliary Territorial Service and was attached to the Royal Army Service Corps. Mrs **Jenny Harper** served in the Women's Royal Naval Service and was Oldmeldrum's last surviving veteran who had been in the Armed Forces in World War II when she died on April 12, 2021, aged 99. **Agnes Hourston**, nee Rennie, served as a nursing auxiliary in the Civil Nursing Reserve. She trained at Bangour Hospital, West Lothian, before being posted to Monymusk House, which had been requisitioned for use as a hospital. **Ada McGillivray**, nee Marshall, served in the Women's Royal Naval Service and performed clerical work at the Admiralty's offices in London.

**Margaret Myers**, nee Wood, (pictured) was a driver in the Mechanized Transport Corps. She served in London, where she drove staff cars, chauffeuring civilian and military VIPs. Among her passengers was the eminent economist, Lord (John Maynard) Keynes, whom she drove to the Treasury or the "Bullion Yard" as he called it.

### What is a Reverse Advent Calendar?

A reverse advent calendar is a holiday activity focused on giving rather than receiving. Unlike a traditional advent calendar, where one opens a small door or pocket to find a gift or treat each day leading up to Christmas, a reverse advent calendar involves giving something each day. The concept is simple but impactful: Each day, you place a non-perishable food item, toiletry, or other essential into a box. At the end of the advent period, the filled box is donated.

Here's how you can create your own reverse advent calendar:

**Get a Box:** Find a large box or basket to hold the items you'll be collecting. Label it clearly so everyone in your household knows what it's for.

**Set a Time Frame:** We are doing an extended Advent again this year from 12 November to Christmas Day.

**Pick Items to Donate**: Up until 11 December we will collect items for their Christmas Eve Box appeal. Items needed would include, hot chocolate, mug, colouring books, christmas stories, socks, Christmas pjs, markers, games, etc.

**Add Daily:** Each day, add one small item to the box or maybe one large item a week. You can do this as a family activity, taking turns to place items in the box.

**Donate:** Bring in your items to the church throughout Advent and we will watch our community box grow of donations. Baskets for collection will be at Meldrum Church and Meldrum Hall.

The reverse advent calendar is a wonderful way to embody the spirit of giving during the holiday season and can serve as a reminder that small, consistent acts of kindness can make a big difference in the lives of those less fortunate.



I know what you're thinking why we are writing about Rainbows which occur after a shower of rain? But we're not! We want to tell you about the Rainbows section of Girlguiding Association. Rainbows are for girls aged between 4-7 years. We are all about developing self-confidence, building friendships, learning new things, and having fun. Girls get their hands dirty with arts and crafts, try out cooking and playing games. We are all about learning by doing.

This year the Rainbow unit has had a busy year, we have had 8 Rainbows awarded their Gold awards, the girls worked hard to complete all the required challenges and badges in order to obtain this. The girls have also learned several new skills including basic first aid, safety awareness and had fun learning about science and taking part in experiments. This is alongside our regular crafting activities and also the fun we have playing games in the unit.

### **Oldmeldrum Brownies (Age 7-10)**



1st Oldmeldrum Brownies enjoyed a busy first term at the Pavilion. We welcomed some new Brownies and all worked on our Know Myself Theme award. Highlights included going back in time to 1990s Brownies, trying on Leader Judith's Brownies uniform and learning all about pocket inspection! We have learned new games and also some singing too. Coming up in term 2 we have another busy and exciting term with a visit from a Therapy Dog, visit to the panto, and we celebrate International Day of People with Disabilities with a visit from a Team GB para-triathlete who will take us through our paces as we attempt to train like an athlete!

2<sup>nd</sup> Oldmeldrum Brownies meet weekly at the Church Hall. In our first term this year we welcomed 10 new Brownies, we are mainly focusing on skills for our future and how we can think of others. We decorated and filled shoeboxes for the Shoebox Appeal. We learned about disabilities and how we can achieve things with a disability and put the girls through their paces. We also asked the community to help us collect toilet rolls as we have required 600 to make advent calendars, the response we received was amazing so we have taken it 1 step further and will be also donating our Brownie made advent calendars to the Community Pantry.









Guides is a relaxed, welcoming space where you can have fun, learn and be yourself with good friends from 10 to 14 years of age.

A place where you can explore the things you love and do stuff you've never done before. Where else can you think up a new sport, make a new perfume, cook over a campfire, design an advertising campaign, have a mocktail party, raise money for a charity you believe in? At Guides, you can do all of this and much more.

This year our Guides have had a unit holiday in Cullen which had a wellness theme, some of the Guides also joined with other units in our County and attended a camp at Aden Country Park in the summer and we had a couple of members take part in the International camp in Holland in the Summer. The Guides have also taken over the community café in the church hall, we had a great morning hosting and raising funds for camping equipment for the unit.



### Meldrum Bourtie & Daviot Community Council

### October 2023.

At our September meeting, Jack Rigby, Digital Stakeholder Lead Officer, Aberdeenshire Council, gave a presentation. It was very informative and covered commercial broadband expansion in our area, the R100 project- providing access to superfast broadband, alternative broadband solutions, public switched telephone network retiral and other areas of digital engagement. The Community Council specifically asked about a) the Scottish Broadband Voucher Scheme and how to apply for it and b) if existing phones will work on the new proposed system from 2025. We are trying to get illegally parked vehicles removed from valuable car parking spaces in our Baker Street car park. This is proving to be a lengthy process but our Councillor, Derek Ritchie, is working with Police Scotland on this matter.

Weeds, blocked drains and potholes continue to be a problem and we continue to inform Aberdeenshire Council. We hope that action is taken soon. Recent weather conditions highlighted again how extremely important drain maintenance is and we have stressed the urgency of this to the council.

We plan to update our Local Place Plan. We'll involve the public in open meetings again and progress from there.

We have a few outstanding issues with Aberdeenshire Council Roads Department. We hope a representative will attend one of our meetings soon. If there are any issues you wish to bring to our attention and raised, please contact secretary@oldmeldrum.org

The Coat of Arms flag has been taken down for the Winter. It will be repaired and replaced on the Town Hall when the floral displays appear in The Square next year.

All community organisations do wonderful work. Recently M.A.I.G. was awarded level 5 (Outstanding) in Keep Scotland Beautiful, It's Your Neighbourhood. We congratulate the team on this achievement.

We have been approached by a Mr. King from Wingham, New South Wales in Australia. He wishes to "twin" his town with Oldmeldrum. The King family lived in Barra Castle for 400 years from 1200 to 1596 A.D. He and his wife have visited Oldmeldrum several times. If anyone would like to lead a Twinning Group and explore this possibility, please contact our secretary.

Bus services continue to be a concern, especially to Daviot residents. The 421 (ex Bains) service will now be operated by Premier Coaches but the Oldmeldrum to Inverurie via Daviot journey will not be replaced. We will monitor this situation and take our concerns to the next Bus Forum which should take place in the coming weeks.

The next Market Day will take place in Oldmeldrum Square on Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> November.

### MELDRUM AMENITY IMPROVEMENT GROUP

The MAIG Committee strives to enhance and enrich the facilities of the town and in addition to our 2 main projects e.g., the summer floral displays and the town's Christmas Illuminations we introduced the Meldrum Pétanque Club which is free to all members of the public.

Continuing to provide new amenities to the town, in 2021 through various successful grant applications the group was able to set up the Meldrum Chapter "Cycling Without Age" The electric Trishaw provides the ability for our elderly citizens and those with restricted mobility to get out and about, meet old friends and allows our passengers to visit such places as the William Forsyth Community Garden, Hoodles Playbarn, Glengarioch Distillery where elderly passengers enjoy a wee dram courtesy of the Visitor Centre and a tour round Meldrum House Hotel and its wonderful scenic landscapes.

Another of our projects entailed Funding provided by the Community Council Secretariat which allowed MAIG members to undertake the installation and floodlighting and lock blocking around the base of the town's War Memorial. There is a contingency fund supported by MAIG, Oldmeldrum British Legion, Meldrum and Daviot Community Council, and Meldrum Sports Committee to carry out any maintenance of the floodlights. We are grateful to the Kirk Session for agreeing to provide the energy requirements for the floodlighting of the Memorial.

In 2019 MAIG entered the town in the National "Keep Scotland Beautiful" and for their efforts, MAIG volunteers were awarded Silver Gilt and the Rose Bowl Trophy for the best new entrant. During the pandemic, the group withdrew from entering. However, this year our committee member Tony Denison prepared our submission for Keep Scotland Beautiful "It's your Neighborhood" designed to attract volunteer-led community groups that are cleaning and beautifying their neighborhood. For their efforts, our volunteer team was awarded the highest award Level 5 Outstanding.

We often hear of organizations having difficulty in recruiting and retaining members, MAIG is fortunate to have an excellent team providing an extensive scope of talents in which we continue to make improvements to our facilities and our projects.
