### Trustees' Annual Report Year ended 31 December 2020

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in Note 1 to the accounts and comply with the General Assembly Regulations for Congregational Finance, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) published on 16 July 2014 (effective 1st. January 2015).

### **Objectives and Activities**

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world.

As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry.

It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Due to the 2020 Coronavirus pandemic all 'in person' activities had to cease between 22 March and 16 August at which time regular services resumed in Meldrum but with severe restrictions on capacity. Our church hall remains closed to all activities, Bourtie Kirk opened for a special 'Carol service' in December.

It is our aim and objective to resume all our 'in person' activities as soon as we are allowed to do so. This will include services of worship at Meldrum and Bourtie Parish Church comprising of regular weekly worship in Meldrum Church, monthly worship at Sheltered Housing and Residential Care Home establishments. Evening prayer services held on 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month at Meldrum Church. Services on the first Sunday of each month at Bourtie Kirk. We will resume our annual bereavement service and formal communion services which are held twice per year and informal services at the end of each month.

Youth activities, which have also been greatly affected by the virus, comprising of Sunday School, monthly Primary School Chaplaincy and monthly Academy Chaplaincy will resume as and when we are allowed.

Over the year we have focussed on helping our local community, a team of volunteers from our membership offered their services to help individuals with shopping collecting prescriptions etc and groups such as the British Legion and the Aberdeenshire Foodbank.

Our Pastoral Care team and Flower committee have remained active throughout the year. Keeping within the guidelines, social distancing etc they have managed to keep in touch with people in our parish and delivered flowers to those who have been bereaved or were ill. We also undertook a huge outreach programme over Christmas where we put together a comprehensive 'Advent Bag' which had crafts, quizzes, games, Bible study material based on the Christmas story, candle and sweets. The Advent bag was gifted to all primary school children at Meldrum Primary and offered to all our members.

We increased our online presence by developing our website, Facebook page and Youtube channel to include regular posts of reflections, worship service videos, short daily Advent devotional videos and a secure group chat room. We developed prayer walks for Easter, Remembrance and Christmas in the grounds around Meldrum Church. The walks featured boards with short devotionals, prayers and QR codes linked to hymns and carols. An Advent online Bible study was held over a 5-week period via Zoom.

In early March our Nominating Committee selected Rev Alisa McDonald as the minister they wished to propose to the Kirk Session and congregation to be our new Minister. The next steps were delayed due to the lockdown measures being taken; the Induction service did eventually take place on the 13 October 2020.

During the summer our Interim Moderator, the Rev. Dr Paul McKeown had to stand down due to personal reasons, the Rev Euan Glen stepped in as our Interim Moderator.

### Achievements and Performance Cont'd

Most of our activities, including worship services, had been either cancelled and/or severely disrupted due to the 2020 Coronavirus pandemic. Online worship replaced 'in person' worship for a large part of the year and the reopening of Meldrum church had severe limitations on the number allowed to attend worship, this was controlled by introducing an online booking system. As not all were able to reserve a place in church, we recorded all services, some audio only most video recorded, and posted on Facebook, on our Youtube channel and website. We have therefore split the attendances at the various 'in person' activities listed in the foregoing section to show separately average attendance for the first quarter of 2020 and then from 16 August to 31 December.

17 Funerals were conducted during the year (2019 - 11) of which 12 were members (2019 - 6). No baptisms were conducted during the year (2019 - 0).

### **Financial Review**

The Covid 19 pandemic had a considerable effect on the finances during the year covered by this report due to the factors outlined previously.

The offerings for the year ended 31st December 2020 (with comparable figures for 2019) are made up as follows:

Of the above donations, £3,016 was unrestricted (2019 - £3,511) and £240 was restricted (2019 - £371). Tax recovered on Gift Aided contributions was £9,045 (2019 - £11,462).

Of a total membership of 359 (incl. 5 adherents), 190 members now gift aid their offerings. This represents 52.9% of the membership including adherents.

The number of members and adherents who give by standing order is now 179. 41 members give through weekly freewill offering envelopes and 20 by other identifiable methods. The balance give through the open plate, or do not give. A total of 240 members donated by identifiable methods during 2020. This represents 67% of the membership.

Overall, the annual incoming resources fell from £107,060 in 2019 to £85,579 in 2020 while expenditure rose from £88,996 in 2019 to £110,492 in 2020.

Part of the reason for the increased expenditure was essential repair and maintenance work undertaken at the manse prior to occupation by our new minister. This accounted for just under £23,000 of the expenditure and there were also additional costs associated with work to allow us to reopen the church after the initial Covid closure.

We also took advantage of the Corona Virus Job Retention scheme with one employee being furloughed since the end of March but retained on full salary rate although this is kept under review as the financial compensation schemes change.

### **Investment Policy and Performance**

The trustee's policy for investments is that all investments should be held in one or more of the following:

The Church of Scotland Investors Trust Government Stocks (Gilts), or Bank Fixed Term Deposits

The Church of Scotland Investors Trust has three funds for Growth, Income and Deposits.

The Growth Fund is very largely equity based and is intended for long-term investment. The fund is operated on a unitised basis and aims to provide capital growth. Units can be purchased or sold monthly. Income is distributed gross in May and November. The Growth Fund is professionally managed by Newton Investment Management Limited based in London.

In the 12 months to 31st December 2020, the Growth Fund performance was -0.61% against a benchmark of +3.06%

The Income Fund is intended for medium term investment and aims to provide immediate high income with funds invested predominately in fixed-interest securities and operated on a unitised basis.

As with the Growth Fund, units can be bought or sold monthly with income distributed gross in March and September. The Income Fund is professionally managed by Royal London Asset Management, based in London.

In the 12 months to 31st December 2020, the Income Fund performance was +6.9% against a benchmark of +7.20%.

The Deposit Fund is intended for short-term investment and aims to provide a high rate of interest. Deposits are repayable on demand, with interest calculated quarterly in arrears, paid gross in May and November. The fund is invested mainly in short-term loans to banks and building societies. The Deposit Fund is professionally managed by Thomas Miller Investment Limited, based in London and Edinburgh.

The Deposit Fund interest rates are set quarterly and are currently set at 0.25% The average rate during 2020 was 0.54% The average rate during 2019 was 0.84%.

Further details of the Church of Scotland Investors Trust can be found on the Church of Scotland website.

No bank fixed term deposits are currently held. Due to the drop in bank interest rates, the amounts held in bank accounts has been reduced as much as practicable and the money placed with the Investors Trust Deposit Fund.

The markets have been impacted by the global pandemic and remain volatile. However, the unit values of our holding in the Investors Trust have held up well. At the end of 2020, the values of the units in the various funds were as follows:

### Risk Management

The principal risks facing the charity have been identified as follows:

The church membership has an ageing profile and there is a general decline in the numbers of younger people wishing to join the church. This is not unique to our organisation but is evident across the country. At a local level, this has a potential impact on the level of donations being received and the potential for the charity income to be adversely affected.

The trustees have adopted a policy for stewardship which runs on a 3-year rotation cycle based on time, talents and money to try and minimise the impact of the above. In addition, we are looking at new methods of attracting younger members to become involved with the church.

On a more positive note, we are confident that with the induction of our new Minister we will be able to start reversing the above trend.

2020 has proved to be a challenging year financially with income being reduced due to the lockdown measures imposed on us from the Scottish Government and Church of Scotland. Our planned Stewardship campaign aimed at raising regular contributions had to be postponed, this along with other income sources, such as funeral donations and donations for the use of our hall being denied to us has impacted our reserves and will have to be addressed when the restrictions on our activities are lifted.

The glebe lands, which are vested in the General Trustees of the Church of Scotland and are not included in these accounts, have been re-marketed and provisionally sold to another developer, again subject to planning consent. The trustees currently await the new developer to obtain planning consent before the sale can be completed. The planning application is currently live with Aberdeenshire Council.

During 2016, a new manse was purchased as the existing manse was due to be sold along with the glebe lands. This new manse was funded by a loan from the General Trustees and will be repaid from the proceeds of the sale of the glebe. A further short-term loan of £50,000, repayable from the sale of the glebe, was granted by the General Trustees to assist with professional fees associated with the new church development.

The above-mentioned loans are not included in the balance sheet but are noted as a contingent liability (See Note 12).

There are financial risks associated with the investments administered by the trustees. Values of investments are subject to market forces and the value may go up or down. The trustees consider that, by adopting the policies outlined in the Investment Policy and Performance section above and the regular performance monitoring of the funds in which the monies are invested by the trustees of the Church of Scotland Investors Trust, the risks are acceptable.

### **Reserves Policy**

The charity trustees have considered the reserves required and have taken into account their current and future liabilities. It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately 12 months expenditure including designated funds. At the year end the Church held unrestricted funds of £194,231 of which £516 had been designated for fabric. The remaining balance of £193,715 represents about 20 months expenditure which, while higher than the policy, is primarily intended to be used as part of the funding for a refurbished church and a community building. See Note 15 for details of the unrestricted funds.

The church also held £291,050 of restricted funds which have been provided for the purposes specified in Note 15.

The Barbara Thomson and Sylvester Thomson Legacies held under Endowment Funds may be utilised to assist financing a high-cost capital project in the foreseeable future – See Note 15.

### Structure, Governance and Management

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

The Kirk Session meets approximately eight times in the year and, in addition to its responsibility for spiritual affairs within the church, is responsible for secular matters such as approval of proposals put forward by the various "Task Force" groups which are formed and disbanded as required. These "Task Forces" can include non-trustee members and report back to Session. This has been found to be a practical method of overcoming a reduced eldership.

The congregation is a registered charity, number SC015960 and is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form) and is subject to the Acts and Regulations of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

### **Accounting Policies**

The principal accounting policies, which are considered material to the accounts, are set out below.

### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014 and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102), the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity.

### Reconciliation with previously Generally Accepted Accounting Practice

In preparing the accounts, the trustees have considered whether, in applying the accounting policies required by FRS 102 and the Charities SORP FRS 102, a restatement of comparative items was needed.

As the 2019 accounts were prepared using the policies required by FRS 102 and the Charities SORP FRS 102 then the trustees consider that no further restatement is required for 2020.

### Fund accounting

Funds are classified as either restricted funds or unrestricted funds, defined as follows.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific requirements as to their use, which may be declared by the donor or with their authority or created through legal processes, but still within the wider objects of the charity.

Endowment funds are funds which have been given on the condition that the original capital sum is not reduced, but the income therefrom is used for the purpose defined in accordance with the objects of the charity.

Unrestricted funds are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. If parts of the unrestricted funds are earmarked at the discretion of the trustees for a particular purpose, they are designated as a separate fund. This designation has an administrative purpose only and does not legally restrict the trustees' discretion to apply the fund.

### **Incoming resources**

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received, and the amount can be measured reliably.

### Donated services and facilities

Donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised as income when the charity has control over the item, any conditions associated with the donated item have been met, the receipt of economic benefit from the use by the charity of the item is probable and that economic benefit can be measured reliably. In accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) the general volunteer time of congregation members is not recognised.

On receipt, donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised on the basis of the value of the gift to the charity which is the amount the charity would have been willing to pay to obtain services or facilities of equivalent economic benefit on the open market; a corresponding amount is then recognised as expenditure in the period of receipt.

### Accounting Policies (Cont'd)

### Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the bank.

### **Fixed Assets**

The charity has the right to occupy and use for its charitable objects certain tangible fixed assets, including the Churches, and manses, vested in the Church of Scotland General Trustees. No consideration is payable for the use of these assets. Expenditure incurred on the repair and maintenance of these assets is charged as resources expended in the Statement of Financial Activities in the period in which the liability arises.

The buildings included in the balance sheet consist solely of the Church Hall in Albert Road, Oldmeldrum. All tangible fixed assets costing in excess of £5,000 having a value to the charity greater than one year, other than those acquired for specific purposes, are capitalised at cost. Buildings have not been depreciated as the trustees are of the opinion that any depreciation would be immaterial. This judgement is based on the opinion that the value of the church hall is mainly in the value of the site rather than the building itself and hence any depreciation would be minimal.

### **Investments**

Fixed asset investments are stated at fair value at the balance sheet date. Unrealised gains and losses represent the difference between the fair value at the beginning and end of the financial year or, if purchased in the year, the difference between cost and fair value at the end of the year.

Realised gains and losses represent the difference between the proceeds on disposal and the fair value at the start of the year or cost if purchased in the year.

In accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102), all investment gains and losses re reflected in the Statement of Financial Activities as part of the net income/expenditure for the year.

### Resources Expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as the liability is incurred.

### **Taxation**

Meldrum and Bourtie Parish Church is recognised as a charity for the purposes of applicable taxation legislation and is therefore not subject to taxation on its charitable activities.

The charity is not registered for VAT and resources expended therefore include irrecoverable input VAT.

There is a contingent liability to the General Trustees in respect of an interest free loan of £50,000, repayable from the sale of the glebe.

There is a contingent liability of £518,299, due to the general Trustees in respect of a loan made to the charity to enable the purchase of a new manse, which is to be repaid from the sale of the glebe and the original manse. These liabilities will revert to the charity if the proposed sale of the glebe does not complete. Interest payments on the manse loan from 31st March 2018 are included in the sums above. From 1st April 2018, the interest is being allowed to accrue against sale proceeds.

fees. It was initially funded by a loan from the General Trustees which

restricted the use to which the loan could be applied.

Guild This fund is used for Guild purposes and is controlled by the Guild.

Sunday Club This fund is used to fund the children and young persons' ministry work and is

funded by money set aside by the trustees and a share of the income from the

invested funds.

Traidcraft This fund was used as the operating account for the Traidcraft group. Initially

funded by the trustees from Kirk Session funds, the balance was transferred

back to the general fund on the group ceasing to operate during 2020.

Organ Fund This fund was established during 2018 following receipt of a generous legacy

from the estate of late Hilda Webster for the purpose of maintaining and

possible future replacement of the church organ(s).

### 15. Purposes of Designated Funds
