Meldrum Bourtie & Daviot Community Council

The Meldrum, Bourtie, & Daviot Community Council continues to support the people of our area making sure that your views are made clear to Aberdeenshire Council. To enable us to do this we require your help. Please join us, we have a few vacant positions, Come to one of our monthly meetings, or e-mail an issue to our secretary (details below).

Flooding We don't have a major problem in our area, but we do have one or two problems. These problems may become worse due to more spells of severe weather which we are advised by the Met Office will happen in the near future. Action is required about known problems now. Plan and prepare are the key words. We need to make sure that Aberdeenshire Council is fully aware of these problems and is taking suitable action to help solve them. One ongoing problem is the culvert under the Meldrum House roundabout. This takes surface runoff rainwater from Meldrum House estate. It seems that the current culvert, installed years ago, is now too small to handle the current water volume. During severe weather this can result in an overflow leading to flooding of the A947 road and Benview gardens etc. We are currently waiting for information from the council about when they are planning to carry out work to fix this problem. The Community Council has a small supply of sandbags available in Meldrum and we encourage residents to do their best to report blocked drains, and take precautions to protect their homes and help each other should it be necessary.

Resilience We have a small resilience group and a supply of some emergency equipment held in both Meldrum and Daviot. We are currently looking for volunteers who may be available to offer some help should an emergency arise. (talk on the phone, hold a light etc.) It's important that we all plan and prepare to look after ourselves and help each other, if able, for a few days in an emergency. Don't forget you may be cut off due to weather etc., with no electricity for a day or three.

Planning. We are a statutory consultee on all planning matters in our area. One major current development in the design stage is the building of 214 homes on land to the East of Newbarns. Two consultations have been held in Meldrum to date.

Traffic HGV passing through the centre of Meldrum are a major problem which has resulted in severe damage and disruption being caused. This is a matter high on our priority list.

Winter safety: With winter coming round the corner, it's important that we all plan and prepare for possible disruption caused by severe weather. There is a large amount of useful information on the "ready Scotland" web site (https://ready.scot).

The highway code (https://www.gov.uk/guidance/the-highway-code) has some good winter driving information see rules 226, 228, 229, 230, 231, 235, and 236. You should always Plan and Prepare to help Prevent Problems. You may be an excellent driver or rider, but other people are not so good. Another vehicle sliding across the road could result in damage to your vehicle, and or a spell in hospital for you. Remember if in doubt don't go out.

Winter driving essentials

Ensure your vehicle is correctly serviced.

Ensure your tyres are in good condition with good tread depth. Consider fitting winter tyres during the winter months. At lower temperatures, below 7 deg C, they will give better grip than normal tyres.

Make sure your windscreen washer liquid is suitable for the winter temperature.

Keep your fuel tank topped up.

Pay attention to weather forecasts on TV and radio see highway code rule 228.

It's a good idea to carry the following items in the car with you in an easy to reach place see also highway code rule 228 Warm coat, de-icer, high vis vest, torch, mobile phone c/w charging lead that will fit your car, jump start cable and or power pack.

Clear all windows using a scraper and de-icer before setting off If you run the air conditioning it will dry the air and help keep the windows clear see highway code rule 229.

If the weather outside is treacherous, you should avoid driving if possible. See rule 228.

Remember to look after your own safety first. If you become a casualty, you can't help anyone and who will be available to help you?

MELDRUM SOLDIER SERVED IN INDIA AND BURMA

Technical skills learned in Civvy Street have been put to good use by the Army. In the early years of World War II, soldiers who had worked as fitters were directed to the Royal Army Ordnance Corps where they were trained to repair and maintain armoured fighting vehicles as well as mechanised transport.

A Meldrum man who served as a fitter in the RAOC was William Aiken of Fingask Lodge. He was fortunate to survive the Burma Retreat in 1942 only to die from illness not long after reaching the safety of India. Before the war he had been an apprentice fitter at the London and North Eastern Railway's locomotive, carriage and wagon workshops at Inverurie, which he cycled to with other employees from Oldmeldrum. His pre-war military experience in the Territorial Army with the 6th Battalion, Gordon Highlanders, helped him to adapt quickly to Army life. William was transferred from the 9th Gordons to the RAOC in March 1940.

After training, he was posted to India and disembarked at Bombay on July 22, 1941. In December, William was posted to the 17th Indian Division at Ahmadnagar and was attached to the Indian Army Ordnance Corps' workshops there, where fitters were trained in recovering stranded tanks. (See accompanying photograph.) On January 3, 1942, he embarked at Calcutta for Rangoon where British and Indian troops awaited the Japanese invasion of Burma which began on January 22. The defenders' only tracked armour were the Stuart light tanks of the 7th Armoured Brigade, who had come from



North Africa. The tank crews played their part in helping the British forces pull out of Rangoon, which was abandoned on March 7. They managed to bring away enough supplies of food and fuel to help sustain the retreating army. (The accompanying photo shows the crew of a Stuart tank of the 2nd Royal Tank Regiment in Burma during 1942.)



Lieutenant-General William "Bill" Slim, who was appointed commander of the newly constituted Burma Corps, realised he couldn't stem the Japanese advance, and his task was to save as many men as possible to fight another day from the two divisions and armoured brigade of Burma Corps. While William and his fellow-fitters strived to keep vehicles serviceable, the crew of the only surviving Stuart tank was given the task of smashing up expendable motor transport at a road block near Shwegyin so as to deny them to the enemy. Only four-wheel-drive vehicles and ambulances were allowed to embark on steamers for the crossing of the Chindwin River. The other 70 Stuart tanks had been immobilised earlier.

The retreat of almost 1,000 miles in three and a half months was the longest performed by the British Army. Official figures record that 13,000 men were killed, wounded or missing in the retreat, and did not include those who would die later from disease. Sadly, Serjeant William Aiken was among the latter when he died at a casualty clearing station on July 19, 1942, from diphtheria, aged 20. His grave is at Maynamati War Cemetery, Bangladesh, where more than 700 World War II casualties are commemorated.

William's brother, Andy, who had served with the Royal Air Force in the war, was a dedicated member of the Royal British Legion Scotland. The Remembrance Sunday parade at Oldmeldrum, in which he was a standard bearer, had particular significance for him as he remembered his brother who had died so young in the service of his country.

WILLIAM FORSYTH COMMUNITY GARDEN

Our Town and the William Forsyth Community Garden

The **Meldrum Community** Garden Project Charity aims to build on this reputation through the ongoing development of the William Forsyth Community Garden.

The garden already offers a peaceful woodland walk, wonderful views of Bennachie and the Grampians, and a connection to the town's history through its namesake, William Forsyth.

This year, as part of our continued efforts, we've added two new historical information boards to the reverse side of the main garden sign. The first presents a timeline of Oldmeldrum's development—from prehistoric times to the present day. The second shares the story of William Forsyth himself, the

celebrated Oldmeldrum-born biologist for whom the garden is named. He is also honoured through the Memorial Garden within the main site.

We believe everyone has an interest in the past, and we hope these new additions will provide both locals and visitors with something informative, enjoyable, and memorable. They form part of our long-term goal to further establish Oldmeldrum as one of Scotland's must-visit destinations.

Our first meeting of the new session of The Guild was held on Monday 8th September. The Speaker was Dr. Pauline Larmour who spoke on her experience in Malawi 2022-25. Malawi is a safe and beautiful country but also one of the poorest who survive on what they grow. There is a cycle of drought and flood. While Dr. Larmour was in Malawi she was teaching Psychiatry in Medical School where there are now 3 Malawian Psychiatrists and another 7 training. The main issues are Alcholism, Anxiety, Depression and Bipolar. 2 Nurses from Cornhill Hospital also volunteered to go out to Malawi and it was a culture shock for them. The talk was very interesting and enjoyed by all.

The Guild outing was held on Monday 29th September.

We had a lovely meal at the Garlogie Inn served by friendly staff followed by some time in Mains of Drum Garden Centre where we had time for shopping. Everyone enjoyed the day out. Thanks to Bain's coaches and their Driver.

The Guild met on Monday 13th October and the Speakers were Jill Ewen and Keith Linklater from RBS Fraserburgh who gave a talk on Scams and Fraud. They informed us of the types of scams used e.g. purchase, investment, romance, money muling and rental scams. We were advised to use unique passwords. Members shared their experiences of scammers which was interesting. It was an informative talk and very well received.

The Guild met on Monday 10th November and the Speaker was Mhari Watt who gave a talk on The Chelsea Pensioners. Mhari told us about her visit to the Royal Chelsea Hospital in London and showed some slides of the Building including the Living and Dining areas. She also told us that to become a Chelsea Pensioner you need to have a good Army Record, be of good character, good health, no spouse and be over 65. The talk was informative and enjoyed by all.

MELDRUM PATHS GROUP

A very busy year for Meldrum Paths Group has gained us 2 electric strimmers - thank you for voting for us to continue our path maintenance in and around Oldmeldrum.

Our Oldmeldrum Community e-bikes have been in demand, providing the community with both a low carbon and low cost means of commuting and also an opportunity to explore local paths tracks and roads with the attendant social, recreational and health benefits that come with such activity. As part of this project we have introduced Ladies Cycle runs, which have mostly been on beautiful days and involved many unusual landmarks and a cafe or two.

After 13 years of focus by MPG and support of the Community Council, Aberdeenshire Council commissioned a major transport assessment (STAG) to determine the best route for a path linking Oldmeldrum, Inverurie and Daviot. The path will bring immediate community benefits and help the Council and Scottish Government meet their objectives for Active Travel, health and well-being. The final report was approved by both Formartine and Garioch Area Committees and the council is now engaged in reaching out to the landowners along the proposed route.

Our new path constructed to link Forsyth Drive and Meldrum Academy has proved to be extremely popular and due to public demand we have printed a second edition of our popular walking and cycling route map that is available in local shops and businesses.



Meldrum Connect Community Funding **Grants**



Throughout 2024 Meldrum and Bourtie Parish Church awarded a total of £3310 to local community groups. This included grants to Meldrum School, Village Church, MAIG, Meldrum Paths Group, The Community Garden, Girl Guiding and Toddlers.

The grants are provided from our Benevolent Income Fund. This is income from investments which originated from a legacy for the benefit of deserving causes locally and is administered by the Kirk Session.

End of Another Summer Growing Season



It's hard to believe we've reached the end of our second summer growing season!

This year brought an abundance of beautiful produce — especially tomatoes thriving in the polycrubs — and even a successful crop of grapes! We've also dedicated special plots to support our community: one for the food pantry at the British Legion and another for the local primary school. Thanks to generous funding from the church, we will be able to purchase essential equipment for these plots, for which we are truly grateful.





Progress this year has been a little slower, mainly due to the loss of our valued community volunteer Sandy Davidson, and the unavailability of a digger. Nevertheless, the show must go on!

We focused on improving the front gate area, removing weeds, laying down membrane and woodchip to suppress future growth, and edging around the car park — giving the whole site a much neater appearance. It was hard work by hand, but the results were well worth it.

We also prepared the foundations for a log cabin, kindly gifted by a member of the community. The cabin was dismantled last weekend and is now being reassembled by Ian Reid with help from his son Keith — and it's coming along beautifully.

The next step is to lay foundations for the summerhouse gifted by the Meldrum Community Council, which will be dismantled and brought to the site.

Looking ahead, we plan to begin work on the woodland area, creating a peaceful woodland walk for everyone to enjoy. One of our members has already installed bird boxes to encourage nesting and wildlife in the area. As winter approaches, we're preparing for next year — weeding, turning over soil, and for those who follow the "no dig" method, adding fresh compost. We look forward to spring, and to another successful season filled with the same joy and abundance of fruit and vegetables as the last two years. Lorraine Kelly
