What's in a Name? The history of Oldmeldrum Community Group

A brief history after 30 years as Chairman of OCG McEg, CDG by Ron Wallace

Oldmeldrum Community Group (OCG) was formed in March 1986 following prompting and enthusiasm from Anne Simpson, Community Education Worker, after volunteers went door-to-door to survey one in four houses, in Oldmeldrum.

The results indicated a high level of interest in community activities and a large number of individuals were willing to initiate or assist in a wide range of educational, recreational and social programmes.

By March 1986, a Friday Youth Club started in Meldrum Primary School. All activities used existing halls or facilities in Oldmeldrum but the group looked for their own building. As well as targeting activities for under-18s, another main priority for this early group was something for young mothers because there seemed so little for them.

The principal officers elected at the AGM were; Chairperson – Dr Ron Wallace; Vice-Chairperson – Ed Owens; Secretary – Jenny Beber; Treasurer – Richard Jacomb. Also seven other committee members were elected.

By February 1990, the OCG, along with other local groups, was organising a variety of community education activities over six days (Mon- Sat) throughout term-time. These included; Creche, Kindergym, Badminton, Science Club, Computer Club, Cubs, Playgroup, Brownies, Scottish Country Dancing, Craft Class, Highland Dancing, 5-aside football, Yoga, Art Group, Youth Club, Short Tennis and Junior Gymnastics.

By August 1994, the range of activities offered had expanded to include;

2s Group, Adult Art, Aromatherapy, Art for Kids, Badminton (adult & junior), Beginners Guitar, Junior

Computer Club, Craft Club drop in, Creche, Easy Does It (exercise for over-50s), Figure Painting (toy models & figures), French for Children, Kindergym, Model Club, Ramblers (50+), Short Tennis, Yoga, Youth Club (Friday evenings).

To illustrate the range of volunteers and helpers involved; the Junior Computer Club on Tuesday evenings was generally run and supervised by Ron Wallace, but if he was not available, a village resident, Amy, who had celebrated 19 birthdays was happy to take over supervision... the lady in question had been born on a leap year on 29th February so she was actually 76 years old!

In September 1992 the group had the first of various name-changes forced upon it by Aberdeenshire Council, re-labelling it Meldrum Community Education Group (McEg). It did, however, benefit from the luxury of two dedicated rooms (Portacabins in the grounds of Meldrum Primary School - the only school in Oldmeldrum, at that time). The McEq name survived for 11 years until another buzz word was forced on us - the Network Development Group (NDG) which was our most disliked and unhelpful label! Luckily, repeated appeals to the council caused them to relent after two years and a final change was made in 2005 to the Community Development **Group (CDG).** The group survived as this until March 2015 when (again, upon insistence by Aberdeenshire Council) the group was disbanded. The council was mostly very helpful throughout the 30 year existence of this group, with Community Education Workers Anne Simpson, Ian Todd, Bob Leonard, Tudor Gebbie and Neil Ironside providing enthusiastic help.

Oldmeldrum Tennis Club

If you love Scotland (and of course you do!) you may also be interested in local history, visiting interesting places and getting together with likeminded friends for a good blether. If you are, you could also consider joining the North East Aberdeenshire NTS Members' Centre. The Members' Centre was formed nearly 50 years ago with the primary aim of raising funds to support the National Trust for Scotland and, in particular, Haddo House, Fyvie Castle and Pitmedden Garden. Over the course of its existence the Members' Centre has raised and donated many tens of thousands of pounds to fund projects at these local properties. Fundraising activities include organising concerts, talks and presentations and visiting historic houses and gardens, many of which are not open to the public. Most events take place at either Haddo House or Fyvie Castle. Talks are free to members who also get priority booking for ticketed events. Non-members are very welcome to attend. A minimum donation of £3 is requested for talks, while tickets for other events are available through Eventbrite. Look out for event information posted on local notice boards, on NTS property Facebook pages. Upcoming events include "An evening with broadcasters Mark Stephen and Euan McIlwraith" 7pm on the 9th March in Haddo House Library (tickets £15 available through Eventbrite include drinks and canapes); 7pm on the 19th April at Fyvie Castle; Members' Centre AGM followed by a talk on the first flight across the North Sea (Cruden Bay to Stavanger) by Tryggve Gran, NTS Gardeners' Question Time in May at Haddo (date TBD); 8th June morning visit to Finzean Estate (tickets £10 includes light lunch); 26th July visit and tour of Kemnay House (Tickets £15).

They are not only historically important, they are also an important part of our community and these wonderful properties need our help more than ever. 

Meldrum Paths Group SCIO are working to develop and improve pathways in the Oldmeldrum area, promote responsible access and provide opportunities for walking and wheeling (bicycles, pushchairs and wheeled mobility aids).

Paths linking communities

We are working hard in partnership with Aberdeenshire Council to deliver the community's longterm priority of a safe pathway for walking and wheeling that links Oldmeldrum and Inverurie. Other routes that we are working to develop include links to Daviot and to Pitmedden. The Group is also seeking to establish shared space designation on local minor roads for vehicles, pedestrians, riders and cyclists and have also started an electric bike hire scheme to make the countryside accessible to many more people – see article below.

Oldmeldrum Community E-bikes (A project by Meldrum Paths Group)

We are seeking to provide low carbon travel facilities through our community e-bikes project. This is a project to encourage local folk to get out and about on a bike. We are very grateful to Cycling Scotland, Fisher Decommissioning, the Energy Saving Trust and Aberdeenshire Council for the support we have received to get this project off the ground. Our e-bikes are modern, comfortable and efficient machines that will take the strain out of climbing the local hills. They will help you to explore the beautiful countryside around Oldmeldrum and get some exercise and fresh air without the worry that you won't be able to pedal up a steep hill.

Hiring an E-Bike

We have two types of e-bike for hire.

Step-Through, commuter style e-bikes are suitable for mainly road use and are very comfortable. These bikes don't have a crossbar.



Our Hard-Tail eMTBs are suitable for both road and moderate trail rides.

All the e-bikes are really easy to use. We will provide lights, repair kit, a helmet, a lock and a charger and show you how to use your e-bike the first time you hire.

Where can I go on an E-Bike?

Sustainable travel

Our scheme is all about encouraging sustainable local active travel and leaving the car at home for relatively short journeys and leisure rides. Consider using an e-bike to commute to work or for other essential journeys such as shopping. It's great to use them for leisure as well. The battery will take care of the hills for you!

For 2023 we are offering 7 days hire Friday to Friday for just £25. That's less than £4 per day! We will also offer concessions on request – just contact us if you require this.

Hello,

I don't know about you, but this year I feel like every part of my being has longed for and needed the remedy of Spring. Lighter days, warm air, fresh rain, the sound of the birds chirping away. Every year I am reminded how marvellous the gift of Spring is in demonstrating before our very eyes the beauty of rebirth, new life, and the blossom of hope that springs all around us. It is as if the very earth itself is reliving the story we tell as Christians, of hope reborn for all in the renewal of life on that first Easter morning. But, for all the burst of colour, from the snow drops to the tulips, to the new shoots of green buds... Spring can also be a hard season. My youngest goes to Haddo Kindy, and outdoor nursery on the grounds of the Haddo Estate. As you drive up the long drive you see the devastation created from Storm Otto, the graveyard of trees and branches lying on top of the already devastated patches from Storm Arwin a year ago. As I write this my home country, the United States, is facing unprecedented storms all across the whole span of the country, from snow, wind, rain, and tornados. It has only been a few weeks since the devastating earthquakes in Turkey and Syria took the lives of around 23,700 people and left millions without homes. Spring is a season of struggle. As Christians we journey through the season of Lent before the Holy Week of Easter and resurrection. A reminder that Jesus fasted for 40 days alone in the wilderness to prepare himself for the ministry ahead of him. It seems the wilderness we live in nowadays is the vastness of nature crying out in pain and need under the pressure of climate change. I wonder what the wilderness can teach each of us in this changing season. Change is hard for us as people. But what we are seeing more and more of is how hard this change is on our planet as well. Change is hard. That is the lesson of Springtime. Sometimes our ideas bloom too early and die by a cold snap. Sometimes we build the nest in a tree that can't withstand the rising winds. But, sometimes the winds calm down and the sounds of nature sing and we understand again the power of struggling through the changing landscape in order to arrive at the other side. As people of faith we cling to hope in all things. A hope that defeated the death itself.

She told us about the trip with her family and some members of the Congregation.



The Oldmeldrum Green Growing Space



The Oldmeldrum Green Growing Space is excited to announce that the hard work put in by the OGGS lead group with support from the Meldrum community, Aberdeenshire Council, and local businesses has led to construction starting on Oldmeldrum's very own Allotment Site in the coming weeks.

Since the first village meeting held on zoom in April 2021, work has been ongoing behind the scenes. To come up with the best location, design the site, seek rental and planning permissions, secure funding, source materials, and the expertise to get the project off the ground. During this time, our lead group, with Gary Oliver at the helm, met regularly over zoom and in person. The site at Meadows Vale in Oldmeldrum was the perfect location. The site has the added advantage of being exposed to all-day sunlight and will be home to around 30 plots ranging between 5m x 5m, 10m x 5m, and 10m x 10m. Each plot will be supplied with a shed for storage and a water butt for rain collection. With growing space for disabled access through raised beds and a communal Polycrub undercover tunnel, a wildlife wooded area, space for communal leisure areas, a future fruit orchard, and a pumpkin patch!

During our time together, the lead group members have visited various established allotments in the Aberdeen and shire area. Sites such as Aden Country Park Allotments, Garthdee and Slopefield allotments, and Inverurie allotment. Through these visits, we have gathered the shared knowledge and information of established sites, helping us establish a space for the Meldrum and surrounding area communities to take advantage of.

During the Xmas period of 2021, the OGGS group entered the Meldrum and Bourtie Church Christmas tree competition. We won "best use of materials" with a tree made from used pots!

We also had a table at the Meldrum Day in 2022 allowing locals to see the vision for the site. This gave people the opportunity to show support by buying homegrown fruit and veg seedlings, in our first efforts to raise funds.

Additional funding was secured through successful applications to the National Lottery, Aberdeen Voluntary Action, Scottish Government rural and islands grants. We are currently part of the Co-op local community funding till October 2023.

Our collective vision is to improve mental health through growing fruits and vegetables, environmental sustainability, and community involvement and spirit. Oldmeldrum Green Growing Space hopes to bring together the Meldrum community of all ages, through collaboration with the local primary and academy schools to teach the younger generation about plants alongside seasoned growers.

Roundup Spring 2003

The Rotary Club of Oldmeldrum and District covers a large area including Daviot, Kingseat, Methlick, Newmachar, Oldmeldrum, Rothienorman and Tarves and over nine evenings and one weekend, before Christmas, the Club helped Santa and Rudolph with his Sleigh to visit all of these communities. Santa and the Club would like to thank each of them for the enthusiastic support that we received when visiting - a fantastic £2700 was collected for charitable purposes. Some of the funds are allocated to a Community Fund operated by the Club which is inviting applications for financial support from local individuals or organisations for activities which support these communities.

Applications will be considered for awards of between £50 and £200 meeting the following criteria.

- Applicants must be from these communities or the cause must support the local area around these communities
- Applicants must be completing a portion of any fundraising themselves
- Any item purchased must be for group use / benefit
- Any funds awarded must be utilised within 12 months
- Funds must not be used to cover salary or employment costs in any form
 Applications from individuals who are looking for sponsor style funding to help 3rd party causes will not be considered.

If you have any queries or would like to apply for financial support from the fund please email the Club Secretary at rotaryomd@gmail.com who will send you an application form which must be completed and returned by 30th April 2023.

The Club works with and supports some of the local Primary Schools and the Academy with Young Photographer and Young Writer competitions and running Interact clubs in schools. We also organise the area heat for the Rotary Primary School Quiz in which all the local Primary Schools compete against each other in a general knowledge quiz, held at the Academy on the 8th of March, with the winners going on to compete in a regional competition.



The next big event for the club is the Easter Egg Hunt at Haddo, which is jointly run by Ellon and Oldmeldrum Rotary Clubs and Haddo House over the Easter period. Meldrum 2030 is holding its 2nd Market Day on the morning of the 29th March in Meldrum Town Square.


Regular monthly updates are received from Oldmeldrum and Daviot community organisations which all do fantastic work. We support them with their work where we can.


